Issues:

- Possibility of 26 bodies under Holiday Inn down the beach from us- may start to smell when they dig them out.
- Our numbers for medical and mental health patients were incorrect. To date our current statistics indicate we've medically treated approximately 2324, inoculated 1236, and mentally counseled 766 people. Staff will be revisiting their paperwork to get a better idea of how many people we've actually treated.

IDHS (Dave Perkins)

2000 units of Tetanus, 79 Hepatitis A units should be here in the next day or two.

Linda Lucas, RN, visited base camp today; she lost everything and is living at Memorial Hospital. Administrators at the hospital want the people living there to get out; please look for temporary housing location for this nurse while you're out in the field. FEMA will not be visiting the area until October 1.

Need rosters of transition personnel.

Bugs becoming a big problem, especially fleas. Please police your living areas-throw in trash cans. 200 mosquito nets coming down tonight.

Medical (Ted Bailey)

329 total visits today including 128 Tetanus shots. Our Lady of Fatima site is primary location our medical staff is working out of. Assessments at 2 churches today- new team will do vaccinations at the churches Sunday.

South Bend Medical Group (Steve Garrison) Treated 90 patients, 15 psychiatric patients, 79 prescriptions, 228 tet. shots. Minor issues- 1) may not need Guard generator after tomorrow at Baptist church, 2) clinic now fully operated by Volunteers of America, 3) 250 doses of Tetanus delivered today.

Mental Health (Drew Klatte)

MS Mental Health people visiting tomorrow. 4 debriefings with BFD, transition with county mental health group. Univ. of MS would like stress counseling for 1/2 of staff who lost their homes and some students. 2 staff with Children's Health Fund mobile clinic. 2 people visited special needs shelters (mostly mentally ill people without medications). Local mental health center will work on providing medications. 99 total visits today.

National Guard (Col. Boucher)

No big changes since yesterday. Small change in fuel amounts (out of diesel). Tomorrow will setup barricades around base camp. Will get military chaplain for ceremony Saturday at Jefferson Davis Cemetery.

Indiana State Police (Mishler)

Last night officers rode with Biloxi Police Department. 22 curfew violations, 1 arrest for possession of cocaine, 3 arrests for possession of marijuana, 4 arrested for illegal possession of prescription drugs, 1 driving under the influence arrest, plus 2 public intoxications. 1 officer checked out a "shots fired" complaint- nothing located.

Road checks conducted throughout last night. 60 new law enforcement officers coming in from across Indiana. News release for ambulance turn over tomorrow at BPD. Ft Wayne news came to visit us today.

Drove 467 miles today; performed 10 tire changes, moved road debris, 1 minor repair, 2 overheated vehicles, 1 jumpstart, 1 request for a wrecker (gave person a list of local wreckers provided by Indiana MCC), 3 escorts, 4 info, 4 abandoned vehicles. Aided chief of Las Vegas police's car today.

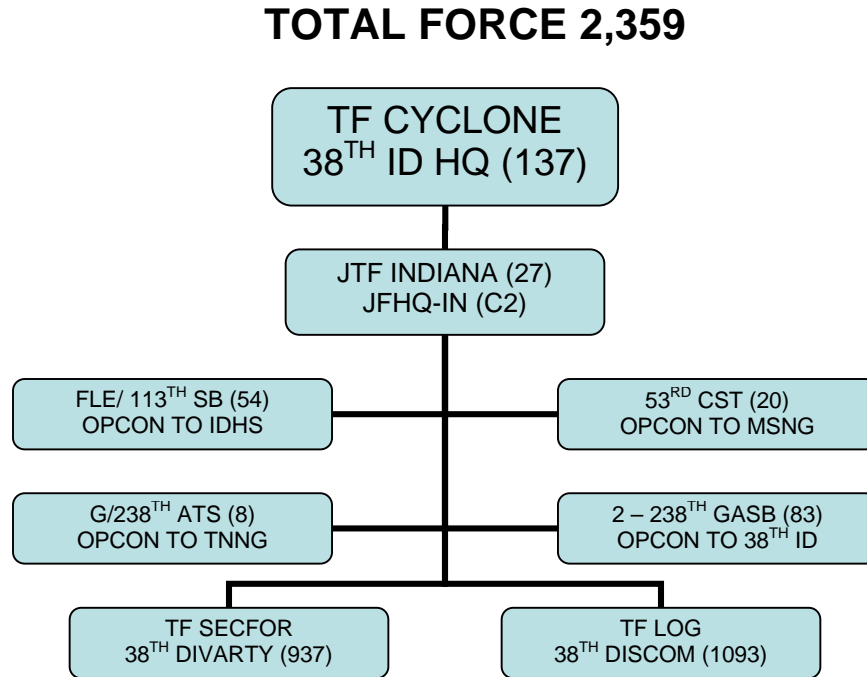

Bruce:

Here is an update regarding MPD's effort to assist Slidell, Louisiana with their situation. First though, I want to reiterate my appreciation for your assistance in getting our teams down there. I'm very proud that a former MPD copper is in such an important position. Reference the project, MPD Team 1 (8 officers) returned from Slidell early Tuesday morning after handing the "football" to Team 2 (6 officers). As you know from the planning process, Team 1 worked for one week and Team 2 will do the same. As the CO of Team 1 I can tell you that we were effective in providing assistance to the Slidell Police Department and citizens in general. We worked in two generally distinct areas—what I would call humanitarian aid and general law enforcement services. What this looked like was day shift hours assisting citizens in removing themselves and their belongings from devastated homes and afternoon, evening, and early morning shift assignments doing more conventional police work. The police work consisted of roving patrols with and without SPD officers, manning curfew checkpoints, assisting and initiating arrests, backing up SPD officers on serious calls, business checks for looters, providing police presence as businesses began to open, providing security for banks as they began to store cash on site, and so on. The days were full.

I should add that Slidell, Chief Freddie Drennan and his police officers in particular, are squared away and impressed me very much. Approximately half of the SPD officers are homeless and yet still reported to work for every shift and none abandoned their posts. We are assessing the need or continued deployment in the area and will send teams as long as Chief Drennan advises we are serving him well. I do know that his concerns are focused somewhat on the time later when the bridge between Slidell and New Orleans is repaired and people from NO can commute to Slidell and when trailer cities are established to house the displaced residents. We have committed to send units later if these issues present a problem, even if we have interrupted our service in the meantime. Will keep you posted ref. that aspect.

Let me know if you need more detail or if you have any questions. As I mentioned to you, I think you would benefit greatly from a trip to Slidell to see their operation if that becomes possible. We would be glad to partner with you on that if we continue to send teams. Again, thank you for your help. Have a great day.

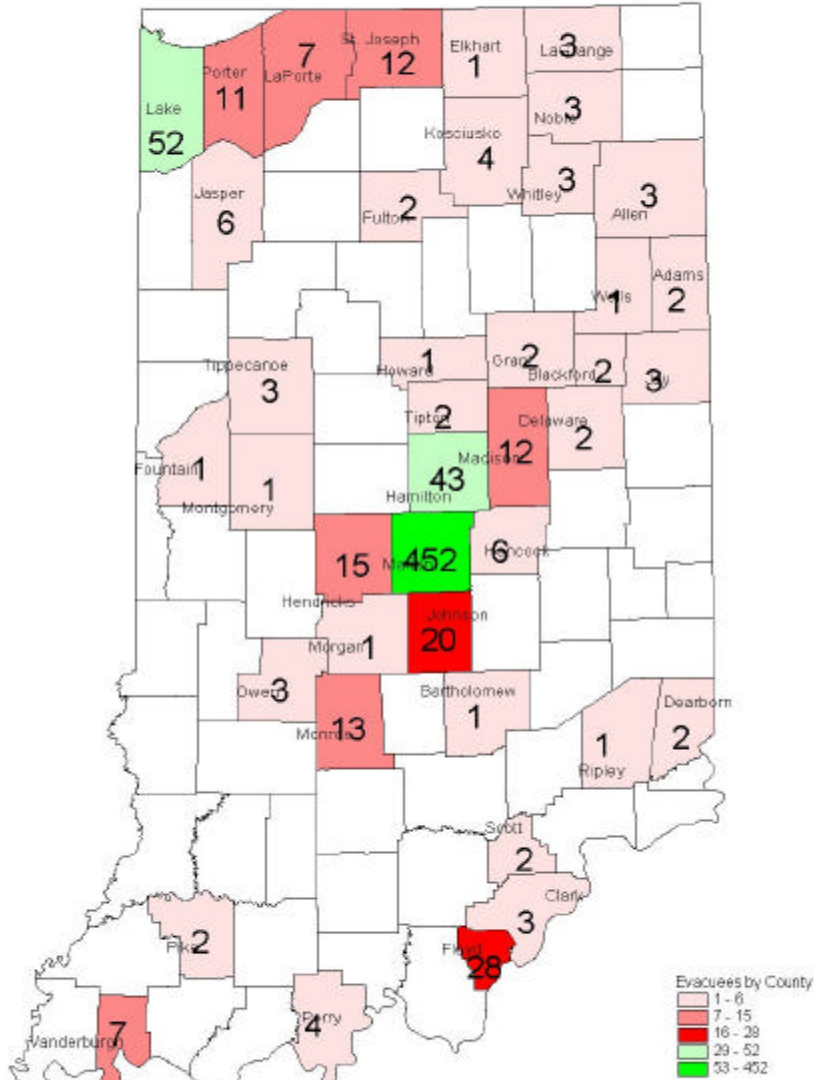

- Indianapolis Creekside Middle School creating School Back packs to go to Mississippi and Mobile, Alabama. Schools Begin Oct 3rd and the target delivery is within 10 days.

The American Baptist Men Disaster Relief of Indiana/Kentucky

- Will deploy their Disaster Relief Trailer to Wiggins, Mississippi on September 22, 2005.
- 6 groups of 10 to 14 people per week scheduled to go there to work in the cleanup process.

North Indiana Conference / United Methodist Church.

- In the process of collecting health kits and flood buckets for later distribution.

South Indiana Conference of the United Methodist Church (UMCOR)

- 2 VIM teams left today for Mississippi - One to Van Cleve, MS and the other to Gulfport, MS.
- 5 Warehouse distribution centers currently the four states of LA, MS, AL, and FL.

- No new activities beyond current fund drives.
