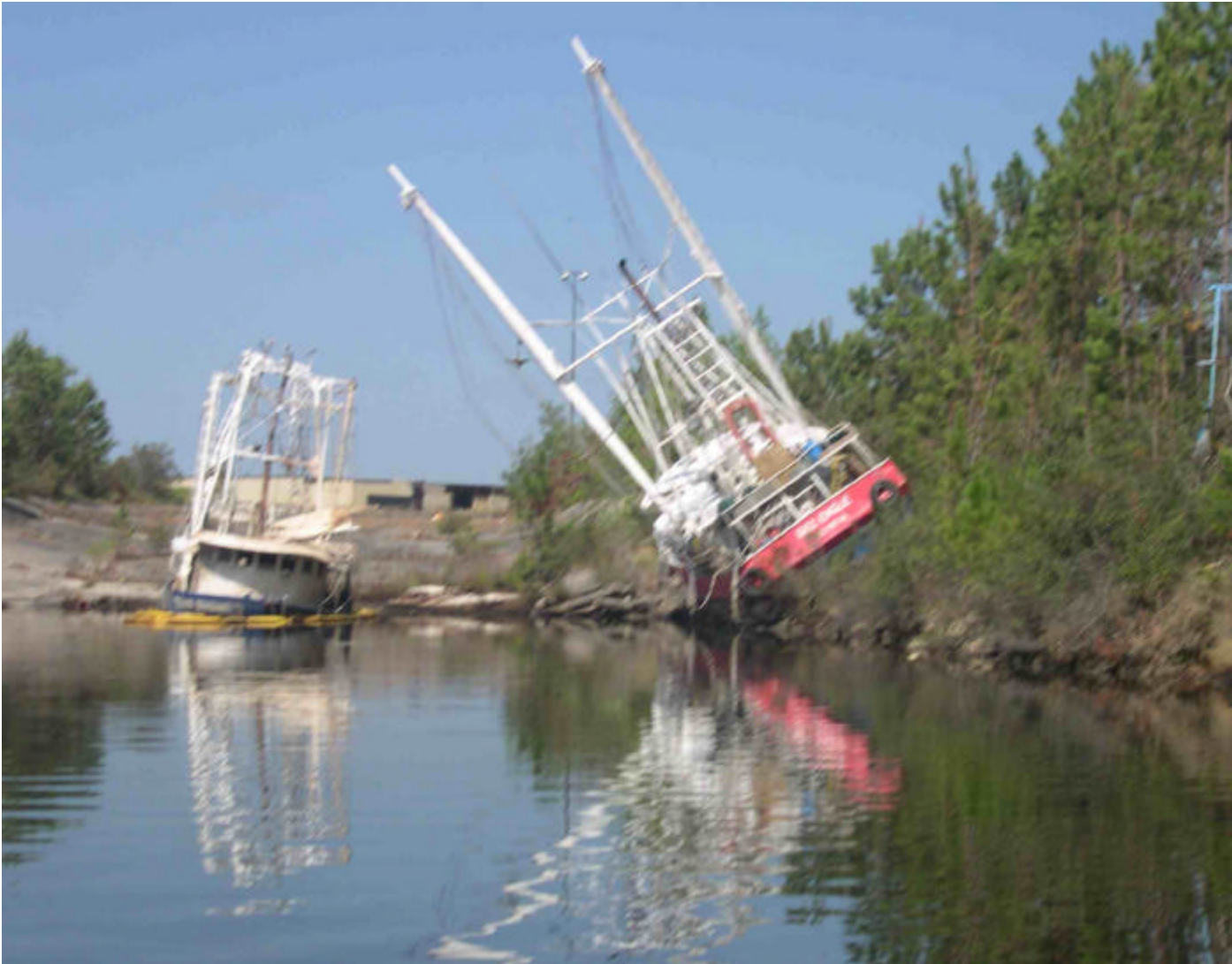

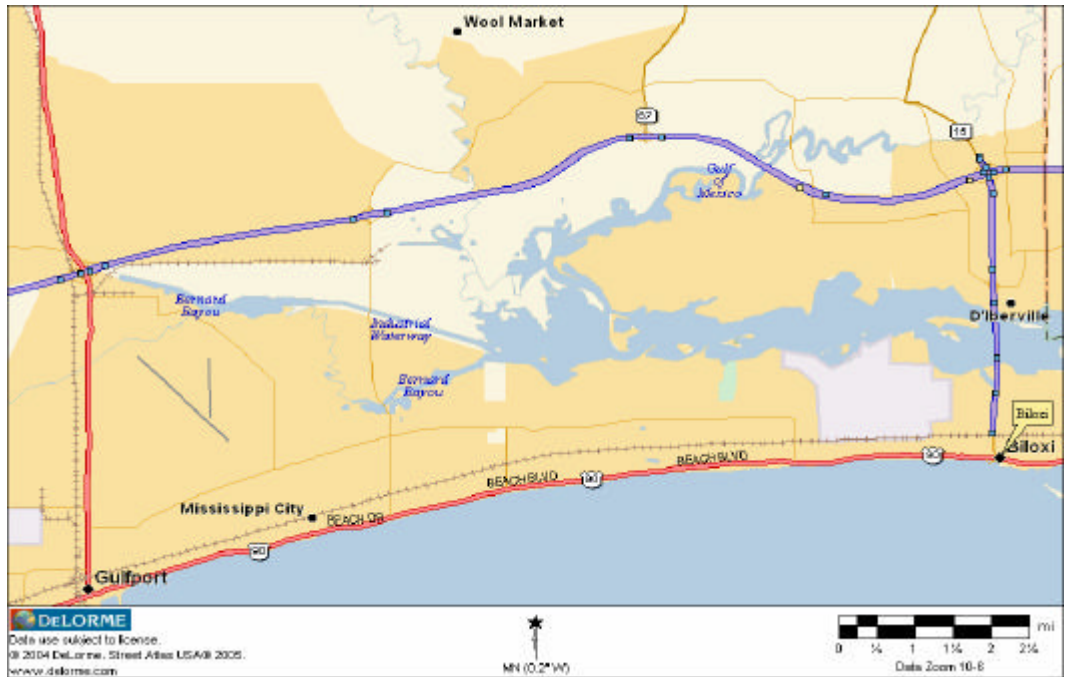

October 4, 2005

**WEATHER**

High near 85, easterly wind 5mph. Tomorrow - High 83 with a chance of rain overnight. Monitoring storm of and moving into Florida. The National Hurricane Center thinks these storms may develop into a tropical or hurricane in the next couple days. I am monitoring these storms at least twice daily.

### ISSUES

Barry McNulty, Environmental Health Specialist from Hamilton County, was transported to Biloxi Mem Hospital with chest pains, cold sweat, and a spike in blood pressure. He was given oxygen, but had some with this. Dr. Whitney accompanied him and Tom Nowacki followed in a state vehicle. Michael Hurst and IDHS EOC were notified of the event. Barry's next of kin will be contacted once more information is known about Barry's condition.

Lesson Learned: all patient totals need to be kept and turned in to the next group during a disaster. Also, track of hours worked with other agencies.

### **DHS - Ken Woodall:**

We have 7 vehicles down here.

### **Medical Liaison - Tom Nowacki**

Medications ordered yesterday (diabetes and heart meds) will be here tomorrow. ESF 8 gave us a few more medications than needed. Tom will be departing Sunday.

### **Dept. of Natural Resources (DNR) - Dean Jenkins**

Many boat repairs today on our vehicles. Activity was slow today. Rural patrol had a car fire and several accidents they assisted with today. EPA took E-coli tests today which showed acceptable standards. Night operations are continuing near Escatawa River.

### **Public Information Officer (PIO) - John Salb**

John was contacted by the medical team to report on a story about a new free clinic in Gulfport. A release was sent out to local media. Made contact with Tom Harneson of WLFI television in Lafayette, Indiana. He is currently contacting a local DNR Conservation Officer for a possible story.

*Major Melville prepared a transition letter to Harrison County MAC, Biloxi PD, and Indiana Homeland Security that outlines the transition dates and schedule times. Our debriefing is scheduled for 1600 hours 11-05 at the Biloxi Public Service Center.*

### **MEDICAL -**

*Administration - Tanya Williams (ISDH):*

*Clinical - Marilyn Whitney (Kosciusko County):*

Visited 20+ people at the new Little Flower clinic. Local media has picked up on story and is providing advertisement. Visited 34 patients at Red Cross at Good Deeds Community Center today. Nurses at shelter very appreciative. Our schedule at the shelter will be early afternoon to early evening. Total of 252 patients today. Of those, 196 were treated; 5568 pills given; 49 prescriptions written; 54 Tetanus shots; 13 touch-up patients. Fatima clinic picked up business in the last few days. 55 patients seen on streets today. Many of patients were elderly, including a 100 year old man and his 79 year old wife who were given Tetanus shot. Concern about working our people too hard and too long, but will scale back hours a little. Received call from Biloxi Public Works who were expecting us, but we were unaware of their need and unable to get there.

### **MENTAL HEALTH -**

*Drew Klatte:*

Total of 681 persons seen today. Had folks at 2 Red Cross shelters and with Dr. Whitney at Fatima. Drew meeting today with mental health center and MS Dept. of Mental Health. Drew relayed that MS needs to have someone to coordinate resources and activities in the tri county area. Met with Red Cross to thank them for letting us visit the shelters. Had some question last night about visiting the shelters under EMAC or under Red Cross authority. We proceeded under EMAC authority. Visited Jackson County Mental Health agency. Jackson County will request EMAC assistance from Kansas City mental health group. Kansas will also deploy out of Hancock County for assistance in law enforcement, medical, and mental health.

*Suzanne:*

Worked on curricula for schools. Will meet with administrators, teachers, then parents for all schools. Good Memorial Health Center is aiding with this program. Will have counselors in the schools for 12-18 months. Will not keep records on patients, but will allow them to anonymously vent their feelings. Because Mississippi is economically strapped with the Hurricane recovery, Indiana will recommend in our after action review that Mississippi work toward getting a grant for clinical help for the schools.

**GUARD- Maj. Bruce Millen:**

5 missions today. Sent 4 soldiers and himself out on the DNR boats today. 1 soldier received a dog bite to the leg during an attempted rescue. Picked up supplies for blood draws on all soldiers. Female soldier went to hospital last night with a back strain. She is doing ok.

23 Guard vehicles including trailers, plus a bus and a van for a total of 25 vehicles.

**DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS - Petri Hayes:**

Vehicle dropped off for air conditioning repair. Did on-the-job training today.
