ISSUES:

- A message from the FEMA representative in the Indiana EOC said he will recheck into getting the FEMA assistance forms to the Mobile Command Center in English so we can distribute them. We will be doing a shift change Saturday so would like to have them by Thursday morning for distribution to locals before the shift change.
- 2 young Caucasian men asked the medical supply personnel for Oxycontin for one of the males. According to the young man (named Bryce Prince or Prints possibly with the CAT 5 contractors stationed across from our camp), his doctor is in New Orleans aiding hurricane victims and he can't get his prescription refilled in Biloxi. Our medical tent does not carry Oxycontin and could not write a script for it. For safety reasons, Monte McKee from ISP was notified of the incident and will be placing an ISP vehicle in front of the medical supply tent overnight.

Forestry crew finished at Hiller Park today. Estimated total of 600+ trees in 2 days. Live oak trees pose significant hazard with springiness. Tree fell on Drew yesterday, but he's ok. Heat fatigue a big issue-slowed down today. Moved to Circle Park today- will finish tomorrow and move to J. Davis home. Will work on helping Keesler AFB in the next couple days (several thousand to fall just on base). Would like guard to help drag brush tomorrow at J. Davis house. Daily AARs conducted- safety a problem when on downhill side of shifts.

Staff will be instructed to collect any found artifacts tomorrow at Jefferson Davis house and drop in box at front door of house.

South Bend Memorial (Steve Garrison)

Would like Scott Stefans (respiratory Therapist) to come to Baptist church tomorrow (Pass Road). Today they saw 157 patients, and assisted with 92 prescriptions. Issues with local pharmacies not taking scripts.

Several news outlets stopped by today; group is getting national exposure. FOX news spending day at Baptist church tomorrow. Assoc. Press guy there today.

544 Tetanus shots, 6 home visits. 395 doses Tetanus left- ordered 1000 more. Will be out of Tetanus shots tomorrow- D. Perkins will check on status of more. Ted has some extra Hepatitis A shots available at Public Works office. Steve will hold back enough tet shots for change of personnel this week.

2 out of state groups working to help get supplies in (vaccinations). Will start warehousing supplies soon through the Baptist church.

National Guard (Col. Boucher)

All systems up and operational. 1640 gallons of fuel remain. 3 small accidents- will do safety stand down tomorrow morning. Benadryl-need permission to get large supply (Methamphetamine brewing uses large amounts of a chemical found in Benadryl). Sgt. Tibbs- Needs to know exact number of people and times of transition Thursday- Saturday 9/15-17. Fuel open at 5:30am for ISP troopers.

ISP (Monte McKee)

Night shift setup checkpoints and had 2 Driving Under the Influence, 2 Public Intoxications, 1 prostitution, and 1 domestic violence case. Caught 2 looters trying to steal a Waverunner. Red Cross site on Poppsferry Rd. was issuing debit cards with \$2000 on them today (only had 500 cards available) with 9000+ people showing up for help; ISP had to help with crowd control. Critical Incident Stress Debriefing at 5:30pm Saturday at Biloxi Police Department for ISP/BPD.

Dave Bursten (Public Information Officer)- News crews will be here tomorrow afternoon

Indiana Department of Transportation (Hoosier Helper)

2 staffers spent 11 hours out today conducting 56 support stops. Encountered 19 abandoned vehicles, 5 tire changes, 1 accident. Trucks losing lots of debris on the way to dumps. 6 minor repairs, 2 overheating problems. Lots of vandalized abandoned vehicles.

Medical and Mental Health Group (Ted Bailey, Tom Kerr, and Drew Klatte)

Total patients treated to date- 4080 locals, 13 responders.

Ted B.- Public Works= 23 patients, 2 Tetanus shots, 3 Hepatitis A shots. At Red Cross Shelters, 75 patients, 40 Tetanus shots. At Our Lady of Fatima, 128 patients, 67 Tetanus shots. Will focus on outreach to neighborhoods tomorrow and will take MREs to neighborhoods. Will send 2 teams to Fatima tomorrow.

Drew Klatte (Mental Health)- issue with red cross shelters being turf oriented. Asked by local county mental health center to find clients- red cross not letting mental health group in. Group of federal and MS mental health service people in trying to help our team (will incorporate them into our group Friday)- Will send out letter asking all red cross shelters to allow mental health folks in. Drew's attending daily meetings with county mental health folks for coordination. Was approached by children's health fund on operation assist out of new york- People needing mental medications. Begin phasing out at public works. 2 teams at fire stations tonight and with Indiana state troopers today. Total patients today was 90.

Watch for safety issues with staff. If safety becomes a problem, cut back hours and review safety guidelines.

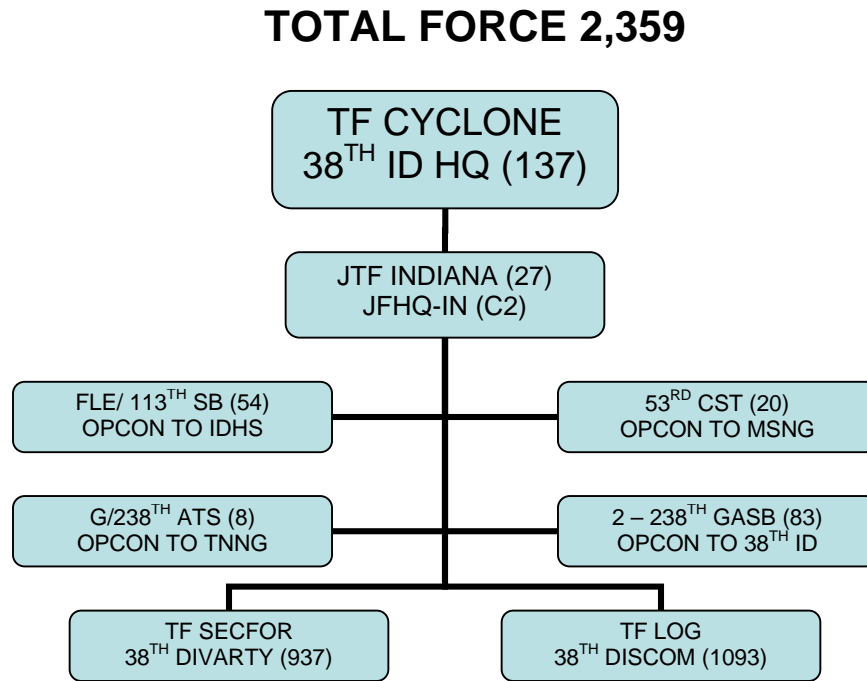

All units had arrival and is in place currently performing current mission (TF Projection) to have initial operational capability to mission supports to TAG of Mississippi within prescribe timeline set forth. All units will work toward set objectives and endstate to be fully operational with Class I (Food and Water) , III (Retail and Bulk Fuel), IV (Construction Materials), V (Ammunitions), VII (Equipment), and IX (Repair Parts), medical, transportation, maintenance support and security operations.

Red Cross in Indiana

The Indianapolis Red Cross shelter is currently sheltering 40.
